Small Breed Dogs	Under 10kg	12 Months	7 years
Medium Breed Dogs	10kg to 25kg	12 Months	7 years
Large Breed Dogs	25kg to 40kg	18 Months	6 years
Giant Breed Dogs	Over 40kg	24 Months	5 years
Cats	4.5kg	12 Months	7 years

- Older pets have a higher risk of joint issues, so senior pet food includes ingredients like Glucosamine that promote joint health and mobility.
- Specially formulated food for senior pets will often include nutrients such as the omega 3 fatty acid DHA, which supports their cognitive function, as well as vitamin E, an important dietary antioxidant.

Tip Always remember to keep a plentiful supply of clean drinking water available for your pet.
